Pentecost Special Offering May 28, 2023: The Pentecost Offering supports our ministries with young people: 25% to Young Adult Volunteers, 25% to the Presbyterian Youth Triennium and 10% to children at risk, supporting improved education and safe havens. The remaining 40% is retained by BPC for our local community. The 2023 offering will be used to support the Chauncey and Lucy Harmon Learning Center at the Calfee Community and Cultural Center in Pulaski County. The Calfee Center's mission is to provide spaces for multi-generational social, educational, and cultural programming to families and individuals in the New River Valley and visitors to our region. The Harmon Learning Center aims to provide both quality early education, which has been shown to improve lifetime

academic achievement, and reliable childcare, which will allow parents to seek employment and improve their families' economic status. Our gift, depending upon the amount received, may contribute towards a diverse and inclusive library, sensory and manipulative play stations, musical and art supplies, cots for naptime, or lab tools for the science and discovery center.
