Season of Creation : September 10-24

The Season of Creation is an annual liturgical season (like Advent or Lent) in which the ecumenical family around the world unites in prayer and action to protect our common home.

Blacksburg Presbyterian Church has been observing the Season of Creation since 2016. This year, our **Season of Creation will be September 10 — 24.**



Our theme for the season will be "**Flourishing for All: Spiritual Postures for Life.**" Each week, we will focus on a posture that will guide us in caring for creation.

Sept. 10: Hope, Jeremiah 32. The posture of hope counters despair and hopelessness; it gives us power and courage, and helps us be grateful that we know what we are doing to our world and how to face it, talk about it and respond to it. What gives you hope? **After worship**, we will have a **screening of *Chasing Carbon Zero*** (NOVA 2023), a 55-min. film which asks the question of how the U.S. can reach net-zero climate emissions by 2025, and talks with the scientists and engineers who are convinced it can be done. Lunch will be served.

Sept. 17: Simplicity, 1 Timothy 6: 6-10, 17-19. The posture of living our lives more simply makes us more free. It reduces the burden we put upon the earth, and allows us to enjoy the gifts it gives us. What can you live without, and how would it free you? **After worship**, we will hold a **Creation Care Fair**, with 8-10 centers for children and adults, providing hands-on activities and information about many topics of Creation Care, ranging from first-hand information about solar conversion, to invasive plant ID, to making take-home seedpods of flowers native to Virginia, to opportunities to contact legislators and leaders about issues of environmental justice. Snacks will be provided to hold you until lunch. In addition, look for a bulletin board with ideas about how to simplify your stuff!

Sept. 23, 9:30: Congregational Hike. Join us for a congregational hike on Saturday, Sept. 23 at 9:30am at Heritage Park with a gathering afterward at 11:30 at Rising Silo. There will be a variety of ways to participate that will be accessible for all ages and many levels of mobility.

Sept. 24: Mindfulness, Deuteronomy 30:15-25. The posture of mindfulness helps us live in the world more attentively, enabling us to make choices about our actions, no matter how small. How do we make a difference for good? How do we embody presence in each moment? Throughout the Season, we will be encouraging you to send in photos of moments of wonder or awe. They will be shown as a looping slide show on the Gathering Space screen throughout the Season (see page 3).

Thanks to the Season of Creation and the Creation Care teams for their creativity, energy, and commitment in guiding us through the Season. *(continued on page 3)*

- for Clay Waite as he recovers from a significant infection.

Items needed for New River Creative Reuse Center: At our **Creation Care Fair on Sept. 17**, one of our booths will feature the New River Creative Reuse Center, and the good work they do in making available all kinds of donated materials for use by local teachers and non-profits. They specialize in collecting things that would ordinarily be put in the trash, and encouraging ways to put them to re-use!

Below is a list of items we will collect that day. We will show you how some of them can be put to re-use, creating items you can take home. The remainder of the donated items will be delivered to the New River Creative Reuse Center.

- Bottle caps (especially plastic colorful ones, see photo at right)
- Sewing thread spools
- Plastic bread or onion bag clips (all colors, see photo below), rubber bands and twist ties
- Paper (full sheets or smaller pieces, not reams)- colored paper, old letterhead, scrapbook paper, art paper, tissue paper, etc.
- Leftover craft materials (pom poms, yarn, pipe cleaners, beads, buttons, fabric, felt, ribbon, craft sticks, sequins)
- Sample sizes of wallpaper, fabric, tile and paint chips
- Pie pans (clean)
- Corks
- CDs and CD cases
- Small tins such as Altoids and film canisters
- Stickers, including the freebies you get in the mail



There will be a box outside the church offices to collect these items just for **the first 2 weeks of September**. In addition, we invite you to bring them on the day of the Creation Care Fair!
