Photo: In Japanese 'Kintsugi' means to "join with gold," an elegant and graceful way to mend broken pottery that dates back to the late 15th century. In kintsugi, pot shards are fused back together with gold, and the gilded cracks become part of the object's beauty. The end result is more beautiful because it has been broken, and stronger because of the breaks. Music notes: "His Song" comes from a suite by Robert Nathaniel Dett (1882-1943), a Canadian/American Black composer known for combining the style of the African-American spiritual with classical music idioms. In describing "His Song" Dett writes: "...the moods of suppressed peoples have oftenest found their most touching expression in song. An [old man] will sometimes sit for hours in the quiet of an evening, humming an improvised air whose...melody seems to satisfy a nameless yearning of the heart." "Spiegel im Spiegel" may be familiar to many from its frequent use in movies. The translation "mirror in the mirror" or "mirrors in the mirror" brings to mind the idea of infinity and eternity, while the minimalist compositional style reminiscent of the sound of bells evokes a meditative state of simplicity and serenity. The Estonian composer, Arvo Pärt, is a devout Orthodox Christian. Now 88 years old, he recently released a new album, *Tractus*. Music: used with permission under One License #A-701634. 
