

MENDELSSOHN

Hymn 129: "Lo, How a Rose E'er Blooming" Verse 1: Choir Verses 2-3: Congregation

1 Lo, how a rose e'er blooming from tender stem hath sprung, of Jesse's lineage coming, by faithful prophets sung. It came, a floweret bright, amid the cold of winter, when half spent was the night.

Citations: Calls to Worship and Confession adapted from Rev. Sarah Speed, sanctifiedart.org. Prayer of Confession adapted from *Before the Amen*. Today's readings are from the writings of Dietrich Bonhoeffer, a German pastor, professor, and theologian born in Breslau, Germany in 1906. As many German Christians aligned themselves with the Third Reich and religious persecution of those opposed to Hitler increased, Bonhoeffer helped organize the "Confessing Church" movement and an underground seminary. He spent time studying and serving in London and New York before ultimately returning to Germany in 1939. His involvement in the resistance movement, including a plot to overthrow Adolf Hitler, eventually led to his imprisonment, transfer to Flossenburg camp, and execution on April 9, 1945. His last words are recorded as "This is the end – for me, the beginning of life." The arranger/composer of the hymn festival music, Michael Burkhardt, is artist-professor of organ at Eastern Michigan University, and founder-artistic director of Hearts, Hands and Voices Worship and Fine Arts Program for Children in Southeast Michigan.
